<p> Vergangenheit ... einmalige oder wiederholte Handlung, Handlung ist abgeschlossen</p>	<b>simple past</b>	<p><i>Yesterday I stood here.</i></p>	<p> <i>yesterday, 2 minutes ago, in 1990, last Friday</i></p>

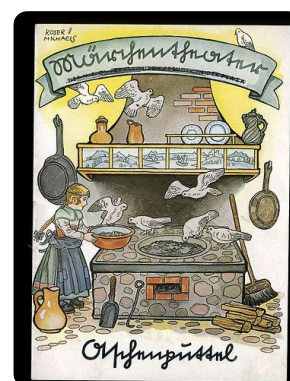
