Present Perfect Progressive or Present Perfect Continuous is a tense, which is used to show an action, that has started in the past and continued until now. The focus is on the action itselfs not on the result.



## How to build the Present Perfect Progressive?

have/ has + been + Infintiv + -ing





**FI** Positive: I have been riding for three years.

Negative: I have not been riding for three years. Question: Have you been riding for three years?
