

adverbs and adjectives



ADVERBS

Adverbs are used to **describe verbs, adjectives** or other **adverbs**.

Adverbs answer: *how, when, where, why, how often* or *how much*.

For example: *That puppy runs **slowly**.*



ADJECTIVES

Adjectives are used to **describe a noun** or **pronoun**.

Adjectives often come before the word they describe.

For example: *That is a **cute** puppy.*



More examples:

1. Sarah thinks **quickly**. (Adv.)
2. We performed **badly**. (Adv.)



More examples:

1. Sarah is a **quick** thinker. (Adj.)
2. Our performance was **bad**. (Adj.)
