- 1 Together you are going to finish the short story.
  - Read the beginning of the short story. **Continue the story**, making sure to include the item that was drawn from the story box in your narrative.
  - Once your time is up, **pass your story** to the next member of your group. Now, read the story you've received and continue it, including a new item from the story box. This rotation continues until everyone in your group has contributed to each story.

- development of suspense
- climax / turning point
- (open) ending


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
