



§ 1 - Talking about the future with will: Statements and negative statements

In English we can use different verb forms to talk about something in the future.



We use the will-future...

- (1) ...when we make **a spontaneous decision, an offer or a promise**
- (2) ...when we make **a prediction or assumption** (we talk about things we cannot control: *I think, I believe, I expect, I hope, perhaps, probably...*)
- (3) ...when we want to say that **something will definitely happen**

(1) I promise! I'll visit you in London! - (2) I'm sure Emily will like her new bedroom. I think the weather will be hot in Greece. You'll probably find the song boring. - (3) Tom will be 15 next month.

long forms

*I **will** write.*
*You **will** write.*
*He - She - It **will** write.*
*We **will** write.*
*You **will** write.*
*They **will** write.*

short forms

*I **'ll** write.*
*You **'ll** write.*
*He - She - It **'ll** write.*
*We **'ll** write.*
*You **'ll** write.*
*They **'ll** write.*

statements

long forms

*I **will not** write.*
*You **will not** write.*
*He - She - It **will not** write.*
*We **will not** write.*
*You **will not** write.*
*They **will not** write.*

short forms

*I **won't** write.*
*You **won't** write.*
*He - She - It **won't** write.*
*We **won't** write.*
*You **won't** write.*
*They **won't** write.*
